**A regularly updated compendium of Beijing's reactions to the Gaza war, including analysis of shifts in its traditional approach of trying to please all sides.**

In almost every conflict between Hamas and Israel, China's messaging has followed a familiar pattern: urge all parties to exercise restraint, reiterate the importance of the two-state solution, and pledge commitment to supporting peace negotiations, typically through an international conference. Historically, Beijing has sought to balance its economic relationship with Israel against its desire to appear as a champion for the Palestinians on the global scene. Hence, even when its statements called out Israel explicitly, they tended to do so in the context of seeking broader de-escalation. During the 2012 conflict, for instance, China [urged \(http://np.china-embassy.gov.cn/eng/fyrth/201211/t20121116\\_1591613.htm\)](http://np.china-embassy.gov.cn/eng/fyrth/201211/t20121116_1591613.htm) "all relevant parties, the Israeli side in particular, to exercise maximum restraint"; in 2014, it immediately called for a ceasefire and [noted \(http://np.china-embassy.gov.cn/eng/fyrth/201407/t20140709\\_1592749.htm\)](http://np.china-embassy.gov.cn/eng/fyrth/201407/t20140709_1592749.htm), "To counter violence with violence will not help resolve problems other than pile up more hatred"; and in 2021, Foreign Minister Wang Yi [stated \(https://news.cgtn.com/news/2021-05-16/China-to-chair-UNSC-meeting-on-Israel-Palestine-situation-10jpmLFujF6/index.html\)](https://news.cgtn.com/news/2021-05-16/China-to-chair-UNSC-meeting-on-Israel-Palestine-situation-10jpmLFujF6/index.html) that Beijing "strongly condemns violent acts against civilians and once again urges both parties to the conflict to immediately stop military and hostile actions...Israel must exercise restraint in particular."

The latest Gaza war has seen a shift in these talking points. Besides the usual calls for implementing a ceasefire, returning to negotiations, and fulfilling the two-state solution, Beijing has been more direct in criticizing Israel's response to the October 7 Hamas attack—for instance, in an [October 15, 2023, call \(https://www.timesofisrael.com/liveblog\\_entry/china-israels-actions-in-gaza-have-gone-beyond-the-scope-of-self-defense/\)](https://www.timesofisrael.com/liveblog_entry/china-israels-actions-in-gaza-have-gone-beyond-the-scope-of-self-defense/) with his Saudi counterpart, Foreign Minister Wang blasted Israel's actions in Gaza as "beyond the scope of self-defense," describing them as collective punishment. Beijing has also criticized U.S. votes in Israel's favor at the United Nations, while official state media have [amplified \(https://www.nytimes.com/2023/10/28/world/asia/china-israel-hamas-antisemitism.html\)](https://www.nytimes.com/2023/10/28/world/asia/china-israel-hamas-antisemitism.html) criticism of Israel and anti-Semitic tropes. In response, Israeli officials have [expressed \(https://www.jpost.com/breaking-news/article-768098\)](https://www.jpost.com/breaking-news/article-768098) "deep disappointment" with China's stance.

Below are notable Chinese government statements on the conflict so far, including the 2025 ceasefire agreement. As the situation develops and Beijing continues weighing in, The Washington Institute will update the tracker.

"The recurrence of the conflict shows once again that the protracted standstill of the peace process cannot go on. The fundamental way out of the conflict lies in implementing the two-state solution and establishing an independent State of Palestine. The international community needs to act with greater urgency, step up input into the Palestinian question, facilitate the early resumption of peace talks between Palestine and Israel, and find a way to bring about enduring peace."

"China is closely following the escalating conflict between Palestine and Israel. We're deeply saddened by the civilian casualties and oppose and condemn acts that harm civilians. We oppose moves that escalate the conflict and destabilize the region and hope fighting will stop and peace will return soon."

"On the Palestinian-Israeli conflict, China has always been on the side of equity and justice. As a friend to both Israel and Palestine, what we hope to see is the two countries living together in peace and enjoying security and growth together. The key to achieving that lies in the realization of the two-state solution and establishment of an independent State of Palestine."

"The root cause of the cycle of conflict between Palestine and Israel is that the Palestinian question still has not been settled in a just manner, and the fundamental way out lies in implementing the two-state solution. The international community should make earnest efforts to advance the two-state solution with the greatest sense of urgency. China is ready to maintain communication and coordination with Egypt, promote the two parties to the conflict to cease fire and end violence, encourage the international community to form synergy, and provide the Palestinian people with humanitarian support so as to avoid the humanitarian crisis in Palestine, in particular the Gaza Strip, from being even escalated."

The international community should earnestly play its role to jointly promote the de-escalation of the situation and provide the Palestinian people with humanitarian assistance."

“China condemns actions that harm innocent civilians, and calls for an early ceasefire and the end of violence, and resuming talks for peace on the basis of the ‘two-state solution’ to boost the two peoples’ confidence in achieving peace. The international community should play an effective role to avoid further escalation of the situation which will lead to humanitarian disasters. China does not have selfish interests in the Palestinian question, and has always been on the side of peace, equity and justice.”

“On the Palestinian-Israeli conflict, as I just said, China has always been on the side of equity and justice. We oppose acts that harm civilians and violate international law. We are committed to promoting peace talks and achieving a ceasefire and will continue to work for de-escalation and resumption of peace talks...Over the past few days, Special Envoy Zhai Jun has been having phone conversations with foreign ministry officials of Middle East countries, including Palestine, Israel, Egypt and Saudi Arabia, to talk about the current tensions between Palestine and Israel. He called for efforts to cool down the situation, avoid [the] conflict’s expansion, protect civilians and prevent a humanitarian disaster due to the escalation. Special Envoy Zhai Jun stressed during the phone calls that to end the cycle of conflict between Palestine and Israel, the key is to return to the two-state solution as the basis, restore peace talks, establish an independent State of Palestine, and realize the peaceful coexistence of Palestine and Israel. The international community needs to step up to that responsibility and create conditions for the resumption of the peace process.”

“China reiterates its call on all parties to exercise maximum restraints, and its support for all efforts to realize a ceasefire as soon as possible, so as to prevent further escalation of tensions and the spillover of the flames of war impacting regional and international security...The indiscriminate use of force is unacceptable, and neither Palestinian nor Israeli civilians should be targeted...Ambassador Zhang expressed China’s grave concerns about the consequences of Israel’s imposition of a full siege on Gaza and its order of a 24-hour emergency evacuation of the population in northern Gaza. China calls on Israel to heed the appeals of the international community and the UN secretary-general to stop the collective punishment of the people in Gaza, so as to avoid exacerbating the humanitarian disasters.”

The Palestinian question is always the core of the Middle East issue. If this question is not settled in a just and reasonable manner, it is impossible for the Middle East to realize lasting peace.”

The Jewish nation is no longer homeless in the world, but when will the Palestinian nation return to its home? There is no shortage of injustices in the world, but the injustice to Palestine has dragged on for over half a century. The sufferings that plagued generations must not continue.”

“China condemns all acts that harm civilians and opposes any violation of international law. It is necessary for the UN Security Council to take action and for big countries to play an active part. The pressing task is to cease fire and end the war, bring the two sides back to negotiation, and establish corridors for emergency humanitarian assistance to prevent more serious humanitarian disasters. The fundamental resolution is to activate the two-state solution as soon as possible so as to reach broader consensus and develop the timetable and roadmap for restoring the legitimate rights of the Palestinian nation.”

“The latest escalation of conflicts between Palestine and Israel has caused massive civilian casualties and humanitarian disasters, with its spillover effects impacting regional peace and stability. China is deeply concerned about this...In light of this grave situation, China calls for stopping the fight as soon as possible, preventing it from spreading endlessly, and avoiding further deterioration of the situation.”

“China supports the UN in playing a bigger role, realizing ceasefire and de-escalation as soon as possible, getting back to the track of negotiation, and building broader international consensus on implementing the two-state solution. The three-point proposal put forth by President Xi Jinping on the Palestinian question is the fundamental guidance for China to deal with the Palestinian question, and China is ready to continue to strengthen coordination and communication with the UN in this endeavor.”

We call for an immediate ceasefire to protect civilians and avoid a greater humanitarian catastrophe...More and more civilians are paying the price. “After the ongoing Palestinian-Israeli conflict broke out on October 7, more than 280 Chinese citizens were stranded in Sderot in southern Israel and faced high security risk. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs directed the Chinese Embassy in Israel to act swiftly to organize their relocation and evacuation. With the concerted efforts on the ground and back home, the stranded Chinese nationals have all left Sderot. Some have returned to China on commercial flights. According to the numbers we have at this point, since the conflict broke out, over 1,000 Chinese nationals have left Israel for China or a third country. We will continue to work hard to assist our fellow citizens.”

This is the call made by the WHO, WFP, and UNRWA, as well as humanitarian agencies that are carrying out relief work in Gaza...”

“China calls for diplomatic efforts for the immediate release of hostages. At the same time, it should be pointed out that the indiscriminate use of force is unacceptable, that civilian facilities such as hospitals and schools should not and must not be the targets of military operations, and that the safety of UN staff and humanitarian and medical workers must be guaranteed. The international community must act now and urgently. Palestinian-Israeli peace talks should be resumed on that basis as soon as possible. The Palestinians’ right to statehood, right to existence, and right of return must be realized at the earliest date.

“Xi Jinping emphasized that China has all along firmly supported the just cause of the Palestinian people to regain their legitimate national rights. The fundamental solution to the question of Palestine lies in the establishment of an independent State of Palestine that enjoys full sovereignty based on the 1967 border and with east Jerusalem as its capital. The economic needs of Palestine and its people’s living necessities must be guaranteed. The international community should provide more development assistance and humanitarian support for Palestine. It is important to keep to the right direction of peace talks. A more authoritative international conference for peace should be convened as soon as possible. China has put forward the Global Security Initiative, and is of the view that disagreements and disputes between nations should be resolved through dialogue and consultation. China supports all efforts that are conducive to the peaceful settlement of crises. On the question of Palestine, China will continue to speak up for fairness and justice, promote talks for peace, and provide humanitarian and development assistance to Palestine. As a permanent member of the UN Security Council, China will continue to work with the rest of the international community to build consensus for peace, get the question of Palestine back on the right track of the two-state solution, and seek an early resolution that is comprehensive, just, and durable.”

"The Palestinian-Israeli conflict stems from Israel's prolonged occupation of Palestinian territory and Israel's long-standing oppression of the Palestinian people. The Palestinian people fight against Israeli oppression, and their [struggles to complete] the establishment of an independent state on the occupied territories are, essentially, just actions for restoring their legitimate rights. The right to self-determination serves as the precise legal foundation for their struggle.

"Let me clarify that self-determination only applies to two scenarios, namely peoples under colonial domination or foreign occupation. Under no circumstances does the right to self-determination afford any basis for any part or group within a sovereign state to claim a so-called 'right to secession.' International law does not recognize the existence of a right to so-called 'remedial secession' or 'remedial self-determination.' The Palestinian people, being a group residing in territory under foreign domination, is a sui generis international legal person as a whole. The right to self-determination of the Palestinian people has been consistently reaffirmed in multiple United Nations resolutions and the Wall Advisory Opinion. This is also widely recognized by most states and international organizations.

"In pursuit of the right to self-determination, the Palestinian people's use of force to resist foreign oppression and to complete the establishment of an independent state is an inalienable right well founded in international law. Various peoples freed themselves from colonial rule and foreign oppression to realize independent statehood after World War II. Their practices serve as convincing evidence for this right. Numerous UNGA resolutions recognize the legitimacy of struggling by all available means, including armed struggle, by peoples under colonial domination or foreign occupation to realize the right to self-determination. For instance, the UNGA resolution 3070 of 1973 'reaffirms the legitimacy of the people's struggle for liberation from colonial and foreign domination and alien subjugation by all available means, including armed struggle.' This recognition is also reflected in international conventions. For example, the Arab Convention for the Suppression of Terrorism of 1998 affirms 'the right of peoples to combat foreign occupation and aggression by whatever means, including armed struggle, in order to liberate their territories and secure their right to self-determination, and independence.'

"Armed struggle in this context is distinguished from acts of terrorism. It is grounded in international law. This distinction is acknowledged by several international conventions. For example, Article 3 of the Organization of African Unity Convention on the Prevention and Combating of Terrorism of 1999 provides that 'the struggle waged by peoples in accordance with the principles of international law for their liberation or self-determination, including armed struggle against colonialism, occupation, aggression, and domination by foreign forces, shall not be considered as terrorist acts.' It should be emphasized that the use of force by any entity or individual in the name of exercising the right to self-determination outside the context of colonial domination or foreign occupation is not legitimate. Meanwhile, during legitimate armed struggle by peoples, all parties are obliged to comply with international humanitarian law and, in particular, to refrain from committing acts of terrorism in violation of international humanitarian law."

This morning, Member of the Political Bureau of the CPC Central Committee and Foreign Minister Wang Yi attended and addressed the closing session of the talks. The Palestinian factions signed the Beijing declaration on ending division and strengthening Palestinian national unity.

“This is the first time that all 14 Palestinian factions gathered in Beijing and held talks for reconciliation. It brings precious hope for the Palestinian people who have suffered for too long. The declaration commends China’s sincere effort to support the rights of the Palestinians, end division and bring about a unified position among the Palestinian factions. The declaration stresses the need to hold, under the auspices of the UN, an international conference with a full mandate and broad-based participation from the region and beyond. According to the declaration, parties believe that the Beijing talks demonstrated a positive and constructive spirit, and agree to realize national unity among all factions under the framework of the Palestine Liberation Organization, the sole legitimate representative of the Palestinian people. The declaration reaffirms commitment to establishing an independent State of Palestine with Jerusalem as the capital city based on relevant UN resolutions and ensuring the integrity of Palestinian territory including the West Bank, Jerusalem and Gaza. Parties are ready to, in line with the consensus of Palestinian factions and the existing basic law of Palestine, establish an interim national reconciliation government, carry out reconstruction in Gaza and prepare and hold a general election as soon as possible in accordance with the adopted election laws. Parties stressed the need to take practical steps to form a new Palestinian national council in line with the adopted election laws. Parties unanimously agreed to activate the provisional Unified Leadership framework which will function institutionally, and jointly carry out political decision-making. Parties agreed to set up a collective mechanism to fully implement the provisions of the declaration and create a timetable for the implementation process.

“As Foreign Minister Wang Yi said in his remarks, the most important consensus of the talks is to achieve reconciliation and unity among all 14 factions, the most central outcome is the reaffirmation of the PLO as the sole legitimate representative of the Palestinian people, the most outstanding highlight is the consensus on post-conflict governance in Gaza and forming an interim national reconciliation government, and the strongest aspiration is to realize true independent statehood of Palestine in accordance with relevant UN resolutions.

“In his remarks, Foreign Minister Wang Yi put forward China’s three-step initiative regarding the ongoing Gaza conflict. First step: achieving comprehensive, lasting and sustainable ceasefire in the Gaza Strip as soon as possible, and ensuring unimpeded access to humanitarian aid and rescue on the ground. Second step: making joint efforts toward post-conflict governance of Gaza under the principle of ‘the Palestinians governing Palestine.’ Third step: making Palestine a full UN member state and beginning to implement the two-State solution. These three steps are interlocked and all of them are indispensable.

“China and Palestine are each other’s trusted brothers and partners. China looks forward to the day when Palestinian factions achieve internal reconciliation and, on that basis, realize national unity and independent statehood as early as possible. We will continue to work relentlessly to this end with the relevant parties.”

“Gaza has been subjected to more than 10 months of blockade, siege, bombing, and attacks that have killed more than 40,000 people and displaced 1.9 million. 80% of homes in the Gaza Strip have been destroyed, and 85% of the area is under emergency evacuation orders imposed by the Israeli military. In the West Bank, nearly 600 Palestinians have been killed since last October. Such a tragedy cannot go on any longer.

“The international community has repeatedly sent clear calls for a ceasefire and an end to the fighting. And the General Assembly, the Security Council, and the International Court of Justice have all made clear demands. However, we have seen that Israel has turned a deaf ear to them and has not shown any sign of a ceasefire. More than two months after the adoption of Security Council Resolution 2735, the Israeli military operations in Gaza continue causing new casualties every day. At the same time, the repeated provocative and adventurous actions by the Israeli side have intensified the risk of conflict spillovers. The Middle East is hanging by a thread.

“It must be noted that blind faith in achieving a total victory in Gaza will only result in more innocent civilian casualties and will not create the conditions for the release of hostages, nor will it bring peace or tranquility to Israel and the region. Ceasefire negotiations and a political solution are the fundamental way out. It must be noted that humanitarian issues cannot be politicized, hunger cannot be weaponized, and civilian lives cannot be trivialized as bargaining chips. Israel must fulfill its obligations under international humanitarian law by opening all border crossings, guaranteeing rapid and safe access to humanitarian supplies at scale, ceasing restrictions and attacks on the United Nations and humanitarian agencies, and providing support and cooperation for the polio vaccination program in Gaza. It must be noted that sustainable security can only be achieved by upholding the concept of common security. Regional peace must be built with the responsible participation of all parties. Achieving an independent Palestinian state and implementation of the two-State solution is the only viable way forward for the political settlement of the Palestinian-Israeli question.

“China urges Israel to immediately cease all military operations in Gaza, to immediately stop its actions that stoke escalation of the situation in the region, and to end immediately placing obstacles to a ceasefire in Gaza. We urge countries with significant influence to demonstrate a sincere, impartial, and responsible attitude in pushing Israel to cease its military operations in Gaza as soon as possible and to stop the killing of civilians. Rather, it continues to worsen.

“In the past month alone, the conflict has consumed the lives of over 1,000 people in Gaza. Israel issued 16 emergency evacuation orders. Schools and refugee camps that sheltered a large number of people were targeted in attacks. Hundreds of thousands of people were forced to flee time and again, unable to find a safe place of living. Israel continued to further suppress and restrict the UN and other humanitarian organizations, frequently rejecting deliveries of supplies such as fuel. Recently, humanitarian agencies were compelled to evacuate from their centers and warehouses in Deir al-Balah, further causing serious damage to the humanitarian system in Gaza.

“The polio virus seriously threatens the health of children in Gaza. Vaccination is the most effective way to stem the spread of the virus and ensure the safety of children. Virus knows no borders. China supports the appeal by Secretary-General Guterres and urges Israel, in a responsible manner towards its own children and those of the region, to provide security guarantee

and facilitation to the vaccination work. We support the Council in making a strong appeal to this end to avoid further worsening of the humanitarian crisis in Gaza.

"In the West Bank, Israel continues to violate international law and Council resolutions, its settlements continue to grow, and it ramps up searches, arrests, and raids against Palestinians. Since last October, over 620 Palestinians have lost their lives. Yesterday, the Israeli military launched a large scale military operation targeting Tulkarm, Jenin, and Tubas, among others in the West Bank, which resulted in at least 10 deaths and many injuries. China strongly condemns this. Senior Israeli officials in the government recently spoke of using the same approach in the West Bank as they have employed in operations in Gaza. We are shocked and seriously concerned by such extreme remarks that risk global condemnation. Gaza has now turned into hell on earth. We must never allow the same humanitarian catastrophe in Gaza to happen in the West Bank, which will turn the West Bank into another hell on earth. China opposes any rhetoric or action that fuels tensions, condemns all attacks on civilians, and calls on all the parties concerned, Israel in particular, to remain calm and exercise restraint and prevent further escalation of the situation."

"The stark reality speaks volumes about the futility of attempts to win a 'total victory' by prolonging the war, which is at best wishful thinking. Rather, what we do see is the continued escalation of the situation in the West Bank in addition to what is going on in Gaza. The international community must not allow the humanitarian tragedy in Gaza to be repeated in the West Bank. The advisory opinion of the ICJ affirms the long-standing consensus of the international community and pinpoints the crux of the Palestinian question. We urge Israel to heed the strong call of the international community by immediately ending its unlawful presence in the occupied Palestinian territory.

"Ending the occupation is to redress historical injustice and, more importantly, lay the foundation for peace. Independent statehood is the inalienable right of the Palestinian people as a nation, which is unquestionable and undeniable. The prolonged illegal occupation has hindered the realization of self-determination of the Palestinian people and given Israel an exclusive veto over Palestine. This is unacceptable. History offers ample proof that occupation would not make Israel more secure, but would only breed more hatred and antagonism and sow the seeds of instability throughout the Middle East. Only a complete end to the occupation and the establishment of the Independent state of Palestine will truly make it possible for Palestine and Israel to live side by side in peace, for the two peoples to live together in peace and tranquility, and for lasting peace to be achieved in the Middle East.

"The implementation of the two-State solution is the only viable way to resolve the question of Palestine. This is the broad consensus of the international community. It is worrying to hear Israel's repeated rhetoric rejecting the two-State solution. The 11 month-long conflict in Gaza has made the prospect of the two-State solution even more remote. The international community should make greater efforts and demand that Israel implement the relevant resolutions of the Security Council and the General Assembly, cease its military operations in Gaza, and stop its illegal settlement activities in the West Bank. China advocates the convening of a more broad-based and effective international peace conference to revitalize the political prospects of the two-State solution and to work out a timetable and a roadmap for its implementation.

"Today is a historic moment. The State of Palestine has taken a seat among Member States and introduced a draft resolution to the General Assembly that focuses on the implementation of the advisory opinion of the ICJ. At this critical juncture when the world is grappling with the prolonged Gaza conflict and complex and intractable situation in the Middle East, the adoption of the resolution is a historic landmark.

"The resolution demands Israel to end its unlawful presence in the Occupied Palestinian Territory. Independent statehood is an inalienable national rights of the Palestinian people, but the prolonged illegal occupation prevents the Palestinian people from realizing national self-determination and gives Israel an exclusive veto over Palestinian statehood. Occupation will not make Israel more secure, but would only breed more hatred and antagonism and perpetuate a vicious cycle of violent clashes between Palestinians and Israelis. Only an end to the occupation and the establishment of independent state to Palestine will lead to the peaceful coexistence of Palestine and Israel and lasting peace and security in the Middle East.

"The resolution urges all parties to stop arming Israel in its maintenance of the occupation. Military means is not a solution to the problem. Tit for tat violence would only exacerbate hatred. The conflict has cost the lives of many Palestinian and Israeli civilians in several decades, with the bloodshed and carnage continuing today. To tackle the question of Palestine needs political will and diplomatic efforts, not an endless stream of arms and ammunition and violent conflicts. All peace-loving nations should respond to the calls of the resolution and work towards that end.

"The resolution reaffirms that international rule of law must be upheld. International law is the cornerstone of the international order and international norms that must be respected by all parties. There is no exception to the fulfillment of obligations under international law. All states are equal before international law. Any double standard or selective applications are unacceptable. As a member of the international community and a UN member state, Israel must fulfill its legal obligations, implement the relevant Security Council resolutions, and comply with international law, in particular, international humanitarian law.

"The resolution calls for the accelerated implementation of the two-State solution. Past decades saw Israel's continued expansion of settlements in the West Bank, encroaching on Palestinian territory and squeezing the space and viability of Palestine as a state. Israel's actions continue to erode the foundation of the two-State solution and increasingly reveal its rejection of and resistance to the two-State solution. The international community must act with the uttermost urgency to revitalize the prospects of the two-State solution. China supports the proposal in the GA resolution to hold an international peace conference under the auspicious of the GA to discuss the implementation of relevant resolutions and the two-State solution.

"The GA resolution adopted yesterday embodies the broad consensus of the international community in promoting the resolution of the question of Palestine. It testifies to the resolve of the international community to uphold justice and realize peace in the Middle East. For more than three months, we have borne witness instead to the constantly intensifying Israeli military operations, mounting number of conditions for negotiations, and escalating provocations. Not a single moment should be wasted in the quest for a lasting ceasefire and easing of humanitarian catastrophe, but the US instead has repeatedly asked for more time and patience for diplomatic efforts. In the meantime, the Gazan civilians are paying for the time and patience with their lives and suffering. How come the time and patience needed by the US are so costly?

"The spillover effect of the continued fighting in Gaza is manifesting itself at a greater pace. Lebanon and Israel are on the verge of all-out conflicts, imperiling peace and stability of the entire Middle East. China urges Israel to abandon its obsession with the use of force and its illusion of seeking a complete military victory, immediately end its military operations in Gaza, cease infringements on Lebanon's sovereignty and security, and stop any risk-taking that might plunge the region into another catastrophe. Doctors on their way to work were critically injured. These and other harrowing scenes are distressing beyond imagination.

"Remotely detonating communications devices in indiscriminate attacks causing mass civilian casualties and panic in society is unheard of in history. This act is, without a doubt, a gross violation of a country's sovereignty and security and a blatant breach of international law, particularly international humanitarian law. It is an act that tramples on human lives with unconscionable callousness. The attacks were so outrageously brutal and atrocious that they deserve nothing less than condemnation in the strongest terms. So far, no one has claimed responsibility for the said attacks, but different parties have come to more or less the same conclusion as to who did it. We call for a prompt, full investigation to hold the orchestrators and implementers to account.

"Right now, the situation in the Middle East is hanging by a thread. Israel's military operations in Gaza are still ongoing, which have already claimed more than 40,000 Palestinian lives. Meanwhile, Israel is also heightening the tensions around its border with Lebanon. We are informed by some analysis that the recent remotely executed attacks are a precursor to major military operations. We have also taken note of the latest statement from the Hezbollah leadership. We are deeply concerned by the possibility of further escalation of the tensions between Lebanon and Israel. We call on the parties to exercise maximum restraint, and call on Israel, in particular, to forego its obsession with the use of force and to halt without delay its military operations in Gaza, its violations of Lebanon's sovereignty and security, and its adventurism that risks dragging the region into yet another devastating catastrophe. We strongly urge countries with influence over Israel to take tangible steps to stop Israel from going further down the wrong path. We support the Security Council in taking all necessary actions and doing all it can to ease the situation between Lebanon and Israel and to maintain peace and stability in the Middle East."

Any deliberate attacks on peacekeepers constitute a severe violation of international humanitarian law and Security Council Resolution 1701. Such acts must stop immediately. We demand that these attacks be investigated and those responsible be held to account. Measures must be taken to prevent any re-occurrence. We reiterate that all parties to the conflict must effectively guarantee the safety and security of all UN personnel and assets, including UNIFIL. The gravity of the current situation is clear, as is the right direction to deescalation. I would like to emphasize the following three points.

“First, since October last year, the series of destabilizing events that have taken place in the Middle East have resulted in more than 100,000 civilian casualties and left millions of people displaced. The cleanup work will take a decade or so. What’s more, the trauma brought by conflicts will be a lingering nightmare for generations to come. The Middle East cannot afford a full-scale war. The conflict cannot continue to expand. All parties must keep in mind the interest of maintaining regional peace and stability, deal with the current situation in a calm, rational, and responsible manner, and make sincere efforts towards breaking the cycle of violence.

“Second, achieving a ceasefire must be an overarching priority. We note that all parties in Lebanon have already made a unanimous call for an immediate ceasefire. The Arab League has also issued an explicit appeal. It is clear who holds the key to ending this crisis. We urge Israel to set aside its obsession with the use of force, make the right political decision, stop violating Lebanon’s sovereignty and territory integrity, and end its adventurous behavior that could drag the region into a new catastrophe.

“Third, there is no time to lose for the Council to act. The vast majority of Council members have long since reached a broad consensus on deescalating the conflict, achieving a ceasefire, stopping the violence, and seeking a diplomatic solution. To fundamentally alleviate the Gaza crisis, a comprehensive and unconditional ceasefire must be realized. The immediate priority is to ensure rapid and unimpeded access of humanitarian aid to Gaza. The top priority is to support the United Nations in playing a greater role in the Palestinian question and to support the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East in performing its duties. The fundamental guarantee is the effective implementation of international law, especially international humanitarian law.

"Zhai Jun said that since the outbreak of the Gaza conflict, China has provided emergency cash assistance respectively to the UNRWA and the Palestinian government, as well as multiple batches of humanitarian aid to Gaza through Egypt. China will work with the international community to contribute wisdom and strength to quell the fighting in Gaza as soon as possible, alleviate the humanitarian situation in Gaza, and push the Palestinian question back onto the right track of the two-State solution."

"In Gaza in particular, where fighting has been going on for 14 months, more than 44,000 Palestinians have been killed, 70% of them women and children, and over 2 million people are struggling to survive in the hell on earth, among them, babies waiting to be fed, pregnant women in dire straits, and elderly people waiting for medical treatment.

"When life and survival are not guaranteed, is there anything else to speak of? The Security Council discussions on issues of women, peace, and security shouldn't be for the sake of political correctness or sound bite. It should come up with concrete and pragmatic measures. An overriding priority in this regard is to promote a ceasefire and cessation of hostilities. Without creating the conditions for women's security, the Council's discussions will be nothing more than empty platitudes for the women who have suffered so much from war and conflict. We reiterate our call on all Council members to stand united in upholding the authority of the Council's mechanisms and its resolutions and support robust action by the Council to secure an immediate ceasefire in Gaza and restore peace."

"Today, we are meeting in this hall for the emergency special session of the General Assembly. This is because the U.S. has once again single-handedly exercised its veto, paralyzing the Security Council and preventing it from taking the necessary actions to promote a ceasefire in Gaza. On the question of Palestine, the abuse of the veto by the United States is totally unjustified. To ameliorate the detrimental effects of the veto, Indonesia and other countries have submitted two draft resolutions. One demands an immediate, unconditional, and permanent ceasefire in Gaza and the removal of obstacles to humanitarian access. And the other calls on Israel to rescind the bills against UNRWA so as to guarantee its normal functioning, and also appeals to the international community to scale up its support to the Agency. The two draft resolutions speak volumes about the call for justice by the international community. China will vote in favor of the two draft resolutions.

"The conflict in Gaza has dragged on for 14 months. Gaza has been reduced to rubble, and more than 40,000 Palestinians have been killed. The survivors, deprived of the most basic necessities, are struggling in despair. In this unprecedented catastrophe, we have seen indiscriminate bombing and disregard for civilian lives reach appalling proportions; we have seen an individual country unscrupulously condone and shield its allies; and we have seen the selective application of international law and double standards reach unprecedented levels. One cannot help but wonder, have the rules and systems established by the UN over its 80 years of existence become completely irrelevant and useless? Is the world going back to the age where the law of the jungle rules the day? Our answer is this: the world cannot go back to the age of the jungle. Nor should the law of the jungle become the new normal.

"We must push for an immediate and unconditional ceasefire in Gaza. A ceasefire is a prerequisite for saving lives and restoring peace. Linking the ceasefire to other issues or even conversely setting preconditions for a ceasefire is tantamount to green-lighting the continuation of war and condoning the continuation of killing.

"We must uphold the authority of international law. There must be no exceptions in fulfilling obligations under international law. Israel, as the occupying power, must assume its obligations under IHL and effectively remove all impediments to humanitarian access, ensure the orderly distribution of goods throughout Gaza, and guarantee the safety and security of humanitarian agencies and their personnel.

"In particular, we must support and guarantee the normal functioning of UNRWA. The Agency is a source of support for millions of Palestinian refugees in the region. More importantly, for the people of Gaza, it is a lifeline that has no substitute. We urge Israel to cease its suppression and restrictions imposed on humanitarian organizations such as UNRWA. We call on

traditional donor countries to continue their support for UNRWA and refrain from participating in the collective punishment of the Palestinian people.

"We must revitalize the two-State solution with utmost urgency. The two states living side by side and sharing security and development is the only way to achieve peace for Palestine and Israel. The international community should bolster support and provide assurance for the realization of the two-State solution. At present, it is necessary to help the Palestinians to strengthen their governance capacity and support them in reaching an agreement on the future arrangement for Gaza through internal consultations. At the same time, it is important to be vigilant and reject any unilateral moves that erode the foundation of the two-State solution, including further expansion of settlements in the West Bank and attempts to annex the West Bank. China supports the State of Palestine in becoming a full member of the UN. We support the holding of a larger scale, more authoritative, and more effective international peace conference to formulate a timetable and roadmap for the implementation of the two-State solution. China will continue to make unremitting efforts for an early end to the fighting, the restoration of peace in the region, and the realization of a comprehensive, just, and lasting solution to the question of Palestine."

"We call on all parties to the conflict in the Middle East to refrain from actions that may escalate tensions. The pressing priority is an end to the fighting. The conflict in Gaza has dragged on far too long. An immediate and permanent ceasefire is a prerequisite for all work to proceed. The ceasefire between Lebanon and Israel is very fragile. "As the new year begins, people all expect everything to take on a fresh look. Yet in Gaza, death continues to cast its shadow, and the bombings and attacks by Israel do not cease even for a moment. For the people in Gaza, they were not counting down to the happy celebration of the new year, but the next bombing that could happen anytime.

"Right before the new year, a heinous tragedy took place in northern Gaza. The Israeli force launched an attack on Kamal Adwan Hospital, the only remaining comprehensive medical service institution in northern Gaza, forcibly detaining medical and care personnel, forcibly transferring innocent patients, causing the deaths of a large number of people, and plunging the hospital into a sea of fire. This act seriously violates international law, in particular international humanitarian law. It is appalling, and China strongly condemns this.

"It is not the first time that Kamal Adwan Hospital has been attacked, nor is it the only hospital in Gaza that has been attacked. According to the OHCHR report, by June 2024, at least 27 hospitals and 12 medical institutions in Gaza have been subject to 136 attacks, which claimed the lives of over 500 medical personnel. Protecting the safety of medical facilities in armed conflict is a bottom line under international humanitarian law. Without sufficient evidence proving that medical facilities have become hostile facilities, deliberately launching large-scale and indiscriminate attacks against medical institutions that cause casualties of innocent civilians violates international humanitarian law and could constitute war crimes. There is also analysis indicating that the lethal attacks launched by Israel against the medical institutions in Gaza to bring the medical system in Gaza to the brink of collapse are part of the systematic strategy to make Gaza uninhabitable. China expresses its grave concerns over and strong opposition to this. We urge Israel to effectively abide by its IHL obligations, stop turning hospitals into battlefields, stop launching attacks on medical facilities, ensure the safety of medical institutions and personnel, and release all medical personnel detained.

"The conflict in Gaza has already caused an unprecedented humanitarian catastrophe and civilian casualties. As the conflict enters its 15th month and comes to the beginning of 2025, ending the conflict and restoring peace remains the most pressing matter and a duty of which the fulfillment has been delayed by the Security Council for too long. A certain country repeatedly claims that a ceasefire agreement will soon be reached, yet the reality is continued killing and death. I wish to stress that differences in negotiations should be bridged by political will and not be filled with innocent lives, winning the war does not necessarily mean securing peace, and resorting only to military strength does not guarantee lasting security. China urges Israel to heed the strong calls of the international community and immediately stop all acts of military adventurism. China calls up Israel to lift restrictions on humanitarian access for Gaza, stop implementing and revoke promptly the bills against UNRWA, and guarantee safety and facilitation for UNRWA and other humanitarian agencies to carry out their assistance. China supports the Security Council in fulfilling its responsibility for maintaining international peace and security and in taking all necessary actions to achieve a ceasefire in Gaza, alleviate the humanitarian disaster, and implement the two-State solution to respond to the expectations of the international community."

We sincerely look forward to the effective implementation of the agreement, so that a comprehensive and permanent ceasefire can materialize in Gaza to contribute to the deescalation of tensions in the wider Middle East. That said, Israel’s final approval of the agreement is still pending, and the IDF operations in Gaza are ongoing and have added further 80-plus casualties to the tally, all of which tells us that the current situation in Lebanon and in Gaza remains very fragile. The international community, the Security Council in particular, should remain united and work as one to encourage and facilitate the implementation of ceasefire agreements and to maintain regional peace and stability.”

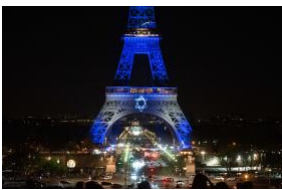
