From releasing its long-delayed CT strategy document to filling crucial professional vacancies, the administration needs to publicly clarify that countering terrorism—Iranian and otherwise—remains a top national security priority.

In April, a suspected Iranian front organization claimed credit for several arson attacks on Jewish sites in London —just the latest in a spate of alleged Iranian plots around the world since the start of the Iran war. As the United States' war against Iran continues, the U.S. counterterrorism community's efforts are especially crucial, both in thwarting Iranian-aligned attacks within the United States and in mobilizing other governments to act against Iran's global terror network. But counterterrorism in general, and Iranian terrorism in particular, is not a high enough priority for the Trump administration, which has more often focused on immigration, antifa, gangs, and cartels...

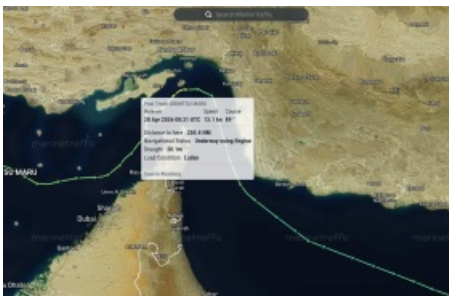
