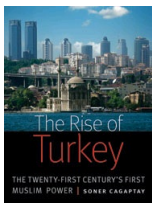
"For the country to become a truly regional player, Turkey not only should act like a Muslim power, but a Muslim power with deep connections to the Western world." - Cagaptay
